We have also been focusing on relationships between peers, and encouraging kind and respectful interactions, sharing, turn-taking and respecting each others ideas in play. We will continue encouraging these positive interactions throughout the year.

FROM THE 3'S

Our Term 1 goals in the three your old Lorikeets group were centred around the children feeling safe and secure within the kindergarten environment, children building positive relationships with educators and peers and also strengthening children's independence skills. To achieve these goals our program focused heavily on predictable routines which gave children the opportunity to be independent – such as children unpacking their own bags in the morning or placing their photos on our belonging tree each session. At the end of the term the children are showing how confident and capable they are with their independence and self-help skills.



Interests in dinosaurs, gardening and sand-timers have kept us busy as we extend on these learnings further. During our first weeks at kinder the children planted sunflower seeds in their own paper cups, caring for them has become one of the children's favourite tasks as they carefully water them each session. We look forward to putting our green thumbs to good use in our new vegetable patch coming later this year.

We have also found that our Lorikeets love a good storybook, and even more if puppets are involved. We recognised this group interest and invited our local library in for a special Storytime, with Robyn from Nunawading Library visiting us for our very first incursion. She sang songs with us and brought along some pop up books which we absolutely loved.

Teacher tips...

DEALING WITH SEPARATION ANXIETY

Firstly, remember that these feelings are totally normal! But here are a few ideas that might help if your child is feeling a little anxious about kinder:

- 1. Tell them the night before it's a kinder day and talk to them about they're favourite activities.
- 2. Agree a drop off routine with them for when they arrive. I.e. "When we get to the playroom, I will read you one book then go."
- 3. Make sure you say goodbye, even if you know it'll upset them. We'll be there to help them settle.
- 4. Talk to your child's educators. Together we can set up some strategies or tools that will support your child during this time of transition





WHAT TO DO IF YOU ARE CONCERNED ABOUT YOUR CHILD'S DEVELOPMENT

First, talk to the teacher. We are always here to talk.

Make a time after a session if you would like to talk
about something in more depth or privately.

Sometimes we might just need a plan in place in kinder,
and other times we might suggest some external
support.

Some of the external supports available include:
- school field officer (learning assessments at Kinder)
-Speech Therapist
-Health nurse (3 ½ year old check up)
-Hearing check
-Eye check
-Occupational Therapist
-Possibility of a repeat year at kinder
